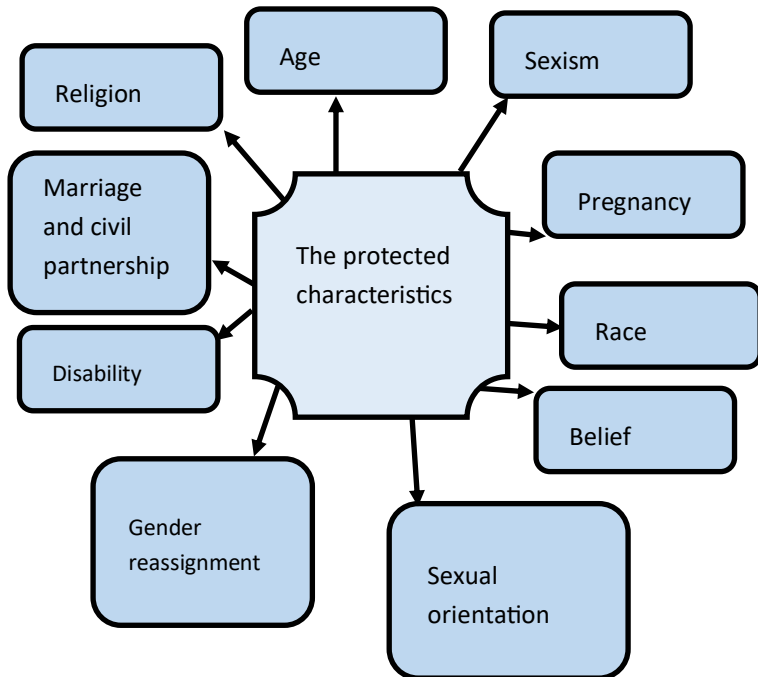

What is equality?

Equality is where you respect everybody regardless of their protected characteristics. The protected characteristics are...



Age—you can't pick on someone because of how old they are.

Sexism—you can't pick on someone for being a boy or a girl.

Pregnancy—you can't pick on someone for having a baby.

Race—you can't pick on someone because of where they are from or their skin colour.

Belief/Religion—you can't pick on someone for what they believe in.

Gender reassignment—you can't pick on a boy for wanting to be a girl or the other way around

Sexual orientation—you can't pick on someone because they date someone of the same gender

Disability—you can't pick on someone because they have physical or mental needs



What can school do?

- We will talk about No Outsiders in our assemblies and classes.

- If we hear someone calling someone a name because of who they are, we will say it isn't right.
- We will ask adults to help if we need it.
