Highgate Uniform Policy:

It is the consensus of opinion amongst parents and the wish of the governors that children wear a school uniform.

We believe wearing a school uniform sets a clear expectation that everyone is equal. It also prepares children for secondary school and later life when many professions have a uniform or dress code that must be followed.

Our school uniform is...

Blue or white polo shirt with black or grey trousers or skirt with a royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan. In the summer girls wear summer dresses, skirts or pinafores, and all children can wear school shorts.

For P.E. the children are expected to wear a plain white or pale blue t-shirt (round neck or polo), blue or black shorts or jogging bottoms and trainers or plimsolls. Please ensure clothes are not sports branded and are plain.

Forest Schools

When children attend Forest School, they will need to bring in old clothes to change into (and wellies in adverse weather). Your child will need a waterproof coat, waterproof trousers and either wellington boots or walking books. On sunny days, they will also need a sunhat and sun cream; on colder days they will need warm clothing, including hat and gloves. Please make sure that their arms and legs can be covered, even on warmer days.

Jewellery

Children should not be wearing jewellery to school. Jewellery can be dangerous when worn during P.E. and at break times. Earrings can be dangerous if they catch on clothing whilst the children are at play and we would prefer it if children did not wear them for school; if your child has pierced ears, studs may be worn if absolutely necessary, but earrings must be removed for P.E. lessons by the children themselves as staff are not permitted to remove earrings. All pupils must also remove earrings for swimming. This is pool policy and is fully supported by the school. School will not be held responsible for lost items.
