When she got back she met Queen Victoria who awarded her with a brooch and some money. She used the money to start the St. Thomas's Hospital Nursing School in London to teach nurses. Her action sparked the Montgomery Bus Boycott, where African Americans stopped using buses until the rules changed. Week 4 To know the impact Rosa's action — Rosa Parks showed that everyone should be treated equally, no matter their skin colour. Her courage inspired many others to fight for their rights. She is remembered as a hero.
